

Rat Trail Mix

Ingredients:

- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup gluten-free pasta
- 1/2 cup Total cereal
- 1/2 cup coffee cereal
- 1/4 cup puffed rice cereal
- 1/4 cup Cheerios
- 1/4 cup raw, unsalted sunflower seeds (in shell)
- 1/4 cup raw, unsalted pepitas (shell pumpkin seeds)

Instructions:

Mix all the ingredients in a large bowl, then transfer the mixture to a large ziplock bag. Finally, feed the mix as a delicious treat.



Small Animal Hanging Chew Toy

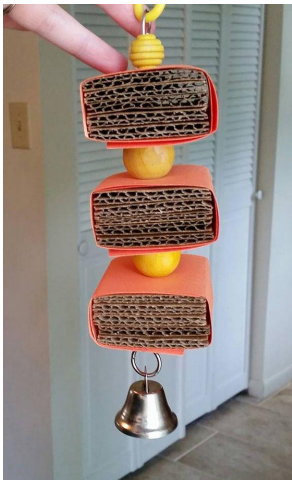
Materials:

- Untreated wood pieces with edges (squares, rectangles, etc.)
- Drill (optional if wood pieces don't have holes)
- Sisal rope
- Scissors
- Optional items: popsicle sticks, untreated wicker, cardboard, raffia, bells

Note: If you use colored wood, please ensure it is non-toxic.

Instructions:

1. Cut the sisal rope to a length of about 12 inches and tie a knot at the top.
2. Arrange wooden shapes or other items on the rope, be creative!
3. Tie a small knot under each wooden shape or item to prevent slipping.
4. After tying on all the pieces, tie a knot at the bottom of your rope and add a bell for extra fun!



Small Animal Rolling Rattles

Materials:

- Clean pebbles or beads
- Kraft paper or a large paper shopping bag
- A small canister with a lid should be 4-5 inches tall or wide
- Sisal rope or twine

Instructions:

1. Rinse and dry the pebbles and canister.
2. Place the pebbles or beads in the canister and close the lid.
3. Cut out a large piece of Kraft paper or cut and flatten a paper bag.
4. Wrap the paper around the canister numerous times to become thick enough to prevent the rabbit from ripping off the paper easily.
5. After wrapping the canister, twist the ends on both sides and tie them off with the rope or twine. You should wrap the rope several times and make several knots so it cannot be chewed off easily. If there is excess paper on each end, cut it so that only a couple of inches remains on each side. You can also add bells for extra fun!
